2022 Annual Barrick Charity Golf Tournament

The fourth annual Barrick Charity Golf Tournament fundraiser was held on May 21st this year, at the Crow River Golf Club in Hutchinson, MN. The event was founded in 2019 by brothers Justin, Jason and Jeremy Barrick to honor their father, Jim, who suffered from depression and died by suicide in 1996, and to raise money for mental health awareness and research. During the first three years \$26,000 was raised, with the money generously donated to the National Alliance on Mental Illness, NAMI St. Cloud Area. The event this year raised over \$13,000, which will be presented to NAMI St. Cloud to assist the expansion of mental health services to McLeod county, who recently gained approval from NAMI National to become a <u>NEW NAMI affiliate</u>.

NAMI St. Cloud's board President Nick Johnston and board member Gary Vieth attended this year's event. They placed about 35 signs providing facts and figures on mental health around the course, with a goal of not only providing mental health information, but also encouraging discussion about this important topic among the golfers and other attendees.

We applaud and appreciate the dedication of the Barrick Family in continuing to sponsor this event, and their generosity in donating the proceeds to help further the work of NAMI, who promotes education, advocacy, support, and reducing stigma for mental health issues.
